1. Definition of AIDS (including what acronym stands for).

2. List the ways it is transmitted (at least 3).

3. List the signs and symptoms (at least 5).

4. Draw a series of pictures of how the HIV virus invades the bloodstream and/or list the sequence of events. (Use the back of this page, if necessary.)

5. List the ways AIDS is not transmitted (at least 4).

6. A short biography of a prominent person who either died of AIDS or publicly acknowledged they are HIV positive – What were the risk factors contributing contracting the disease, how long they have/had disease, what they did/ are doing to help educate the public? (Use the back of this page if necessary.)

7. List some ways in which people diagnosed with HIV or AIDS have suffered from prejudice as a result of lack of knowledge or fear (at least 3).

8. List risk factors (at least 3) and precautions (at least 2) one should take to avoid contracting the disease. Discuss abstinence as most reliable way to avoid it.

3. Click on the words “Background & FAQ’s”, then History of the AIDS Memorial Quilt.
